Project Name: Segment Improvement on US 60 between Washington St. and Rt. 29

Description: Reconstruct the median of the US 60 bridge over US 29 and re-stripe to include one through-lane in each direction along with left-turn bays for the ramps to US 29. Also re-stripe the approaches to the bridge to include turn lanes and one through-lane in each direction. All improvements are with the existing right-of-way.

1. Call to Order

Turner Perrow, Chair, called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm via GoToMeeting.

2. Approval of Minutes: January 16, 2020

Upon a motion made by Jon Hardie, seconded by Frank Rogers, the motion to approve the minutes of the January 16, 2020 meeting were unanimously approved.

3. Public Hearing on Proposed FY 21-24 Central Virginia Transportation Improvement Program (CVTIP)

No comments were received.

4. Election of Officers for FY 20-21

At the July 2019 meeting, the CVTPO Policy Board adopted an informal officer rotation (by member locality) for the future. Per this rotation, the proposed Chair would be Jon Hardie, Campbell County Representative, and the proposed Vice Chair would be Jimmy Ayers, Amherst County Representative.

By consensus, the election of officers as stated was approved.

5. Consideration of Proposed FY 21-24 Central Virginia Transportation Improvement Program (CVTIP)

A motion was made by Bonnie Svrcek, seconded by Jimmy Ayers, to adopt the resolution approving Central Virginia Transportation Improvement Program as presented, and was unanimously approved.

6. Consideration of Proposed FY 20-21 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Frank Rogers made a motion, seconded by Jon Hardie, to adopt the resolution approving of the Unified Planning Work Program, which was unanimously approved.

A motion was made by Frank Rogers, seconded by Bonnie Svrcek, to adopt the resolution authorizing the filing of applications with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation for grants of federal funds under Federal Transit Administration Section 5303 program and state matching funds by the CVTPO secretary, and was unanimously approved.

7. Prioritized Project Listing for Connect Central Virginia 2045 Plan

Scott Smith reported that the PDC, in conjunction with EPR and the Transportation Technical Committee, has been working to determine the specific projects for the Long Range Transportation Plan.

Will Cockrell with EPR reviewed the project list development procedure over the past several months. Using the explained scoring metrics and data assessed during this time, the project list includes 22 projects for the City of Lynchburg, three projects for Campbell County, three for Amherst County, and two for Bedford County.

Scott Smith explained that the Transportation Technical Committee, in consultation with stakeholders in Campbell County, determined that the proposed southern bypass should not be including in the recommended projects being scored. Chairman Perrow recommended that the bypass project be considered, at least partially, due to the potential growth in the area.

8. Matters from the Members

Rick Youngblood reported that VDOT received 33 Smart Scale applications totaling approximately \$328 billion in project costs and are currently in the screening process for all applications.

Bonnie Svrcek thanked Chairman Turner Perrow for his service and leadership to the Policy Board and acknowledged his contributions to the TPO.

9. Adjourn: There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 5:00 p.m.

Resolution of Support for Project Applications Submitted for SMART SCALE Funding by Localities for Projects Within the Boundaries of the Central Virginia Transportation Planning Organization

- **Whereas** the SMART SCALE program directs the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) to develop and use a prioritization process to select transportation projects to be funded for both urban and rural communities throughout the Commonwealth;
- **Whereas** through the SMART SCALE process, projects submitted by eligible entities will be evaluated and scored based on predetermined evaluation measures;
- **Whereas** in review of the scored project list, and considering other information submitted to the CTB on each project, the CTB will be better informed in their funding decisions regarding projects to be included in the Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP);
- **Whereas** to support local and regional planning efforts and consistency with local Constrained Long Range Plans (CLRP), a resolution of support from the relevant Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is needed for all projects within the MPO study area that are not included in or consistent with the adopted CLRP;
- **Whereas** a resolution of support from the applicant governing body or policy board, approved in a public forum with adequate public notice, is required at the time of application; and
- **Whereas** the Central Virginia Transportation Planning Organization (CVTPO) 1) serves as the MPO for the Lynchburg Study Area and by this resolution expresses its support for the projects listed in *Exhibit 1* and 2) is the applicant/sponsor for one or more projects listed in *Exhibit 1*; now, therefore, be it
- **Resolved**, that the CVTPO does hereby support projects described in *Exhibit 1* for submission to the SMART SCALE project evaluation process.
