Public Participation Plan

Policy Guidance

The Central Virginia Metropolitan Planning Organization (CVMPO) adopted a Public Participation Plan (PPP) in April of 2007, which was later updated in July of 2010 and again in April of 2013. The Policy Statement in the CVMPO's adopted PPP specifically states that "It is the policy of the CVMPO to facilitate public information; access and involvement under a collaborative planning process in which the interest of all interested parties, including affected agencies and certain identified population groups, are duly considered. To the extent permissible by law, the policy and technical processes will be made inclusive of and accessible to the aforementioned stakeholders."

The CVMPO's Public Participation Policy Plan identifies a public involvement process for the transportation planning efforts and products of the CVMPO that are in compliance with CFR 23, Part 450.316 pursuant to the current federal transportation funding bill and its amendments. Federal requirements include stipulations regarding public notices and public hearings, complete access to information barring legal or fiduciary restraints, input to key decisions, development of a demographic profile of the CVMPO study area, and the development and deployment of innovative public involvement strategies. The CVMPO's PPP also specifies standard procedures for the development, adoption, and amendment of the Constrained Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), and the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

CVMPO Goals and Objectives

The CVMPO's PPP clearly articulates nine goals, each with a series of objectives for achieving the ultimate vision for the progress and accomplishments of the public involvement program. The goals and objectives are as noted below, and are followed by specific text that demonstrates how the public outreach efforts for this project will meet with stated goals and objectives.

- Goal 1: Endeavor to exceed applicable federal and state statutes regarding the LRTP, TIP and projects of regional significance –the major products of the CVMPO planning process.
- Objective 1.1 All rules pertaining to advertising and holding a public hearing as described in 15.2-2204 (http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+15.2-2204) of the Code of Virginia will be met or exceeded.

Action: The project public hearing will be advertised per the requirements set forth in section 15.2-2204 of the Code of Virginia.

Action Taken: As noted above

Objective 1.2 For major revisions and the addition of projects to the LRTP or TIP a minimum thirty (30) days public comment period will be observed before the "Official Public Hearing".

Action: A 30 day comment period will be observed before the public hearing.

Action Taken: As noted above

Objective 1.3 A formal public meeting will be held to discuss "Long-Range" planning assumptions, at least once every long range plan cycle. Discussion of planning assumptions will be a major topic throughout the LRTP update process, integrated into the public participation process for the LRTP development, including its formal adoption by the CVMPO.

Action: All planning assumptions, including but not limited to future growth, the traffic analysis zones, local and regional goals, operational and demand modeling, and prioritization factors, among others will be shared and explained in depth during the scheduled community meetings and focus group sessions, and in the draft and final project documentation. This same information will be readily available for inspection and discussion at the project public hearing.

Action Taken: Each of the four initial public meetings held in the fall of 2014, the public meeting held in the spring of 2015, and the final public meeting session held in the summer of 2015 included a series of maps showing future congestion levels, goals and prioritization methodology description, and other supporting data such as high crash locations, economic development data, and proposed project locations. This information was illustrated on large scale mapping, and staff was available to explain the information, take notes and comments, and discuss any questions or input at length.

Objective 1.4 At a minimum, notice of intent to hold a public hearing shall be published in local newspapers, including minority-owned publications, and publications targeted toward specific groups, at least fourteen (14) days and no more than twenty-one (21) days in advance of the proposed meeting date. A second notice shall be published seven (7) days prior to the proposed meeting date. The Notice will also be posted on the Virginia's Region 2000 Local Government Council's website and posted at the Council's offices.

Action: The public hearing will be advertised, as directed in objective 1.4, in the local newspaper (News and Advance) and the online publication "Soul of Virginia" (www.soulofvirginia.com) (if the opportunity exists).

Action Taken: The public hearing was advertised in the media with notices placed in the local libraries and the Council's office. Notice was made to the public as noted above.

Objective 1.5 The current LRTP and TIP along with any proposed amendments will be accessible on the Virginia's Region 2000 Local Government

Council's website. Additionally these documents will be available at the Local Government Council's offices.

Action: The plan update will include presenting draft material on a project website that will be linked to Virginia's Region 2000 Local Government Council's website, and the Central Virginia MPO website.

Action Taken: As described above, a project website was established (www.cvlrtp2040.org) and relevant plan information was available through links on that website.

Objective 1.6 The CVMPO will undertake, as part of the LRTP update and as described in the LRTP, an environmental mitigation discussion.

Action: All potential projects identified in the constrained and vision (unconstrained) project listing will include an environmental mitigation discussion and mapping to illustrate how the projects relate to potential environmental concerns.

Action Taken: All of the projects identified through the planning process were mapped using Geographical Information System (GIS) software, to illustrate the project location relative to sensitive environmental resources, community demographics, and cultural resources. The mapping for the top 21 projects, in terms of regional priorities, was then sent to the following agencies and feedback requested regarding their concerns and feedback on policies and procedures that will need to be considered when/if the projects are advanced into the preliminary engineering phase:

1. Virginia Department Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF)

2. Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ)

3. Virginia Department of Historical Resources (DHR)

4. Virginia Department of Environmental Resources (DER)

To date, feedback was received from DGIF and DEQ. The content of the feedback was aimed at providing guidance for future efforts for project review.

Goal 2: Develop a demographic profile of the CVMPO area as a tool to assess, discuss and benchmark public participation, and the harms and benefits of projects with respect to neighborhoods, communities, minorities and concentrations of poverty.

Objective 2.1 Develop Geographic Information Systems (GIS) data layers pertaining to income, population, housing, age, minority status for the CVMPO.

Action: GIS data layers utilizing population and census and car ownership information will be assembled and utilized for the purpose of benchmarking the public participation outreach process. The mapping will be combined with geo-coding of addresses from the locality provided contact lists, website visitors (if they provide address information) and meeting attended address the region. section of residents across the region.

Action Taken: The project contact list was mapped against the local demographic mapping and it appears that a broad representation from the region was contacted and

alerted to the project. The meetings were held at the County offices of the member localities, the Lynchburg public library on Memorial Avenue, and at the James Building in downtown Lynchburg. Both the Lynchburg library and the James Building are situated along GLTC bus lines, and are also located in areas accessible to low income populations.

Objective 2.2 Develop a plan for the management, cataloging and incorporation of useful public involvement related data.

Action: See action for Objective 1.2.

Action Taken: Feedback from the public meetings was documented to the project file, and reviewed as part of the study process. The meeting summaries are provided in *Technical Appendix E for reference.*

Objective 2.3 Incorporate the demographic profile into the LRTP, as a framework with which to display and evaluate the various proposed projects and improvements.

Action: Project mapping, that will include demographic mapping, will be used in the evaluation of the various proposed projects and improvements.

Action Taken: The demographic mapping, showing project location versus relevant census blocks, was produced and considered in the project documentation.

Goal 3: Inform the public about how transportation improvements are made and describe the role the CVMPO plays in the process.

Objective 3.1 Provide regular public opportunities to explain and discuss plans and outline the transportation planning process for the general public.

Action: The project outreach and reporting process will include numerous meeting sessions that are open to the public. The project website will be explicit regarding a description of how the planning process is to be conducted. Project contact information will be provided such that interested parties can call, write, or email the CVMPO to provide commentary or ask questions. Opportunities for comment will be provided via:

a. Website comment

- b. Written comment sent to the CVMPO
- Phone calls to the CVMPO
- d. Direct comments in the two community meetings and the focus group session with the localities
 e. Direct comments at the project public hearing

Action Taken: As noted above.

Objective 3.2 Continue the use of focus groups and steering committees in the planning process to keep stakeholders informed about the transportation projects in their area.

Action: The CVMPO's Transportation Technical Committee (TTC) will serve as the project steering committee. A focus group comprised of representatives of local industry will be formed to help bridge the connection between transportation and economic development. A project contact list will be assembled with input from the CVMPO, GLTC, and member localities. The list will be used to help draw people to the project meetings. The TTC and economic development focus group will be provided information about the project on a regular basis and they will be encouraged to share this information with their constituents, peers, and interested parties with whom they associate.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Objective 3.3 Public information initiatives can include but are not limited to the following:

> information kiosks, mailing lists, public events, focus groups, Virginia's Region 2000 Partnership website, project websites, Virginia's Region 2000 Partnership newsletter, newspaper articles and visual displays of information.

Action: Information about the project will be broadly advertised using various mediums. These include, but are not limited to:

a. Project advertisements will be provided to GLTC and the local libraries

b. Meeting advertisements will be placed in the local newspaper(s)
c. A project contact list will be compiled from each of the member localities and utilized to advertise the project meetings.

- d. A project website will be used that links to the Region 2000/Local Government Council website, the CVMPO website, and the GLTC website.
- e. The initial community meeting will consist of focus group sessions that will be held in Amherst County, Bedford County, Campbell County, and City of Lynchburg
- f. Region 2000 Partnership newsletters will be used to provide information about the project.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Goal 4: Raise the visibility of the CVMPO within the Central Virginia Region as the urbanized area transportation planning body.

Objective 4.1 Utilize a variety of means and visualization techniques to inform the public

about the CVMPO including those listed in Objective 3.3.

Action: Visualization techniques will be utilized to illustrate analysis findings, recommendations, environmental impacts, and other critically important information of interest to the project stakeholders and public at large. The visualization techniques will include the use of charts, graphs, tables, and maps to illustrate project locations, data, study area, and other pertinent project information. The means of informing the public will be as described in the action shown for objectives 3.2 and 3.3.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Objective 4.2 Seek to cultivate a positive relationship with local print and broadcast media in order to establish an environment of goodwill and to seek positive publicity whenever feasible.

Action: The CVMPO will routinely contact the local media outlets, regarding this project, prior to community meetings and the public hearing.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Objective 4.3 Maintain relationships with member government staffs in order to enhance collaboration and leverage the benefits from member government planning and public participation initiatives.

Action: The project process includes numerous meetings with local government representatives, VDOT, VDRPT, and GLTC. There will extensive interaction with these representatives through the CVMPO's Transportation Technical Committee meetings that will be held nearly every month through the 15 month project process.

Action Taken: As noted above

Goal 5: Involve the public in planning, prioritization, and identification of transportation needs.

Objective 5.1 Establish the role of focus groups and steering committees in the planning process

as serving as a communication mechanism between citizen representatives, CVMPO, and CVMPO staff by:

- Ensuring focus groups and steering committees have up-to-date information about CVMPO plans to pass on to organizations and individuals within the areas they represent.
- When appropriate encourage focus groups and steering committee members to consult and collaborate with neighborhood, organizational and local government leaders.

Action: The project process includes numerous meetings with local government representatives through the TTC. Up-to-date project information will be shared at each of the TTC meetings. A focus group consisting of representatives of the economic development community will be formed. The TTC members, and focus group members, will be provided with updated project data and information on a regular basis and they will be encouraged to interact with their constituencies to share information about the project

Action Taken: As noted above

Objective 5.2 Ensure the mobility concerns of the elderly and disabled, bicyclists and pedestrians are represented in focus groups and steering committees.

Action: The project contact list will be used to connect with a broad cross section of the community, including the elderly and disabled, bicyclists, and pedestrians. All concerns and opportunities brought forward during the project process will be shared with the CVMPO for consideration.

Action Taken: As noted above

Objective 5.3 Comments will be provided to and discussed by the CVMPO as part of its consideration of any update to the LRTP.

Action: All comments received will be brought forward to the CVMPO for consideration in the planning process.

Action Taken: As noted above

Goal 6: Obtain and incorporate public comments, reactions and perceptions into plans and solutions where appropriate, and share such comments with local, state and federal officials where appropriate.

Objective 6.1 Provide opportunities for the public to comment in writing or in person on any action being processed by the CVMPO.

Action: The project will include over 16 opportunities for the public to have direct contact with the project team. This includes two community meetings, focus group meetings, TTC meetings, and the project public hearing. In addition, a project website will be used and the public will be encouraged to use the internet to provide input about the project. Finally, written comments will be welcomed at any of the meetings, via direct calling, and via postal delivery to the CVMPO staff.

Action Taken: As noted above

Objective 6.2 Provide multiple means of response that may include but is not limited to: mail in postcards, email, tape recordings, handwritten comments and or voice-mail messages when feasible and/or appropriate.

Action: as noted in the action for Objectives 3.1 and 6.1.

Action Taken: As noted above

Objective 6.3 Comments will be provided to the CVMPO as part of its consideration of any amendments or updates to the LRTP or TIP, as appropriate.

Action: The project team will accept any form of project input, including voice mail, written, recorded, or other forms that may be identified through the project process. All comments received will be documented and provided to the CVMPO for consideration.

Action Taken: As noted above

Goal 7: Make it easier for low income, minority, and all citizens to get involved in the transportation planning process.

Objective 7.1 When possible scheduling public hearings and workshops in the late afternoon and early evening so those citizens that work can attend.

Action: Project meetings will be scheduled for the later afternoon or early evening hours.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Objective 7.2 Publish notices and advertisements in publications aimed at minority and low- income populations.

Action: Meeting notices will be advertised using a variety of means and methods, including providing notices to GLTC for placement on buses, notices placed in the public libraries, advertisements in the local media (News and Advance – for general distribution to the region), the "Soul of Virginia" publication (if the opportunity exists), and direct outreach via emails per the locality's contact lists.

Action Taken: As noted above, with exception that the "Soul of Virginia" media outlet was found to no longer be in existence.

Objective 7.3 Use the demographic profile described in Goal 2 to ensure that initiatives and outreach efforts are adequately targeted to low-income and minority populations.

Action: The project contact list will be used to verify that low income and minority populations are invited. At least two of the community meeting will be held in low income areas.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Objective 7.4 Take advantage of opportunities to coordinate with agencies serving low income and minority populations in their public involvement and public information efforts.

Action: The project outreach effort will coordinate with agencies such as GLTC and other serving low income and minority populations. The project contact list will include representatives from agencies serving these segments of the population.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Goal 8: Comply with the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990

Objective 8.1 All public hearings will be held in facilities fully accessible to individuals with disabilities. All written material will be available in accessible formats for the visually impaired (i.e. large print, Braille, and/or audio tapes) upon request, or personnel will be available for readings. An interpreter for the hearing impaired will be available upon request for all meetings. Every reasonable effort will be made to accommodate individuals with disabilities who wish to participate in the public process.

Action: Community meetings and the public hearing will be held in ADA accessible locations in adherence with ADA requirements. For each meeting, a contact person will be given for members of the public to contact regarding requests for any special accommodations. All meetings will be held at locations that are accessible by anyone wishing to attend.

Action Taken: As noted above.

Goal 9: Comply with Executive Order 13166: Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency.

Objective 9.1 Maps provided by DRPT for the CVMPO Title VI plan show high areas with LEP populations that exceed 5% of the entire area population. This percentage is based on a federal standard. The CVMPO will use these maps to ensure that initiatives and outreach efforts are adequately targeted to these areas.

Action: Based on current demographic and population mapping, there are no areas in the CVMPO region with LEP populations that exceed 5% of the entire area population.

Action Taken: As noted above






