Many people that live and work in this area would like to bike or walk or run along that route but there is no room for them with the traffic and the closeness of the curbing or the edge of the pavement and other non useable surface. Thus the cyclists have to mix with the hiway traffic and the pedestrians are left to struggle through weeds, jump curbs and gaurdrails, tresspass on private property, and dodge traffic. Details: Better than bike lanes: no illegal parking problem, with the budget cuts localities don't sweep lanes and become dangerous, (broken glass, sand,etc) in winter plows pile snow to the side making them unusable, which leads to drivers yelling why we do not use them.

Over my years commuting to work, (AMH to LYH) on 60 W and 29 BUS one thing became clear: drivers HATE to lower their speed to pass safely a slow moving vehicle in front of them, in rte 60 (a two lane road) cars invade the opposite lane even with no visibility to pass me so they don't have to go below the 60 mph speed they are traveling at. Pay attention in Wards Rd and see how many drivers go at the posted speed limit, (35 MPH) for that road, while the northbound side has no sidewalk."

Big Ideas for Transportation in Central Virginia

Start with sidewalks and move up

Details: Focus on repairing and expanding sidewalks from the center outward to the county edges and get counties on board to do the same. Far too many sidewalks are in need of repair and simply end at critical spots leaving pedestrians and those using mobile wheelchairs or other no option but to step into traffic to access their destination. In addition while bike lanes are needed for this area the implementation has left more questions than soluntions. They begin and end in completely random spots for short spans and do nothing to address the need. Bus transportation also is lacking especially for my clients and should be re-examined with support from government to create incentives and accessible stops and better times so people can get to and from work and shopping.

Details: Encourage public transportation use by increasing pedestrian-friendly infrastructure (sidewalks and bikeways) and provide incentives for leaving the car at home or on the ""edges"" of congested areas; provide public parking garages/lots downtown and at the GLTC Transfer Station and implement a free circulator downtown and to the Transfer Station.
